

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PUBLIC STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF OAKWOOD, CLAY COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS SHOWN IN THE RECORDED PLAT OF OAKWOOD FIRST ADDITION

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Oakwood have determined that the public street known as Poplar Drive in the Village of Oakwood, Clay County, Missouri, should be vacated;

and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Oakwood, Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. Vacation of Public Street. That a certain portion of Poplar Drive, a public street dedicated by the original plat of the Village of Oakwood, Flat Book 5, pages 66 & 67, be vacated from South Woodland Drive to Barnes Avenue.

Section 2. Following the final passage of the ordinance, the above described portion of Poplar Drive shall be declared vacated and same shall be recorded in the Office of Recorder of Deeds of Clay County, Missouri.
